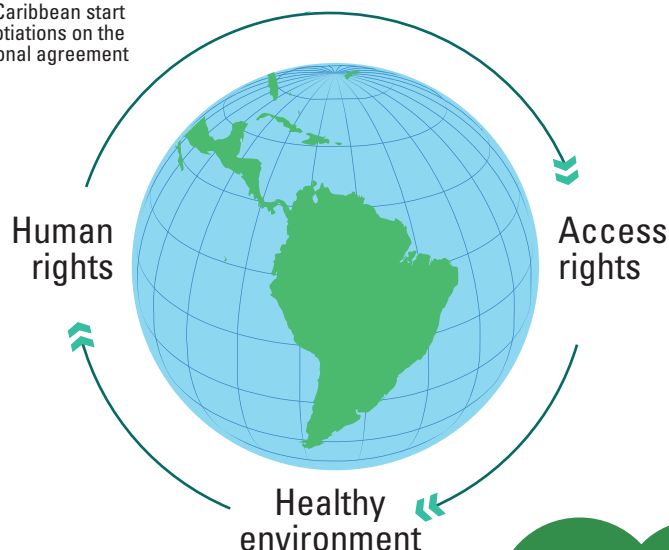

What does the Principle 10 regional agreement strive for?

- » It aims to deepen democracies and social cohesion, build trust in the adopted decisions, eliminate asymmetries and prevent socio-environmental conflicts.
- » It offers a redefinition of the traditional relations between the State, the market and society.
- » It contributes to the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development



Regional developments

20 countries recognize the right of persons to live in a healthy environment in their constitutions

20 countries have enacted access to information laws

20 countries provide for the right of any person or group to bring legal actions to safeguard the environment

25 countries have provisions in their general laws on the environment to promote public participation

18 countries have specialized entities, judicial or otherwise, in environmental matters
